4.1 Description of first aid measures

Self-protection of the first aider

Inhalation

IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists, get medical advice/attention.

Ingestion

Rinse mouth. Give plenty of water to drink. IF exposed or concerned: Get medical advice/attention.
