SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES



4.1 Description of first aid measures
Self-protection of the first aider

No action should be taken involving personal risk. Use personal protective equipment as required. Ensure adequate ventilation. Avoid breathing dust. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.

Inhalation

IF INHALED: If breathing is difficult, remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If breathing is difficult give oxygen. If breathing has stopped, apply artificial respiration. Get medical attention.

Skin contact

IF ON SKIN: Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing immediately. Get medical attention.

Eye contact

IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes. Get immediate medical attention.

Ingestion

IF SWALLOWED: Do not induce vomiting unless instructed to do so by medical personnel. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention.

Causes serious eye damage.

5.1 Extinguishing media

Wet clean or vacuum up solids. Use vacuum cleaner to collect spilt material. A vacuum equipped with HEPA (high efficiency particulate air) filtration is recommended. Collect in closed and suitable containers for disposal. Contain and dispose of waste according to local regulations. Ventilate the area and wash spill site after material pick-up is complete.
